

Privacy Notice for Taxi Licensing

Aylesbury Vale District Council (AVDC) is the controller for the personal information we use about you. We are committed to protecting your privacy when you use our services. The law requires us to give you a Privacy Notice which gives you details about how we use and protect your information.

What information do we have about you:

We can hold the following information:

- Details such as name, address, date of birth, email address and telephone numbers.
- National Insurance number.
- Driving licence information.
- Proof of identity e.g. passport, driving license or utility bill.
- Information about your right to work in the United Kingdom.
- The type of licence you are applying for.
- If you have completed a Disclosure Barring Service (DBS) check.
- If you have ever had any offences (including alleged offences), criminal proceedings, investigations, outcomes and sentences*.
- If you have ever been refused a licence, or had a licence disqualified, by the Department of Vehicle Licensing Agency (DVLA). If you have ever had a licence refused, suspended or revoked by another licensing authority.
- Medical information*.
- Photo image.
- Any other information which may be relevant to your application or the grant or continuance of a licence including complaints.
- Vehicle details.

* this information is called special information and we have given you more information about why we can use it below.

Why are we using your information?

We need your information so that we can:

- Administer the Taxi Licensing service.
- Process applications.
- Undertake enforcement activity.

We can use your information because:

- We need to comply with the law.
- We need it to provide you with a service as a local authority.

We need to use your special information (please see the Council's main Privacy Notice for details) or information about criminal convictions and we can use it for reasons of substantial public interest which are:

- We need it to carry out our duties for taxi licencing under the law.
- We need it to prevent or detect a crime or unlawful behaviour or fraud.
- We need it to protect the public against dishonest or improper conduct.
- We need it to safeguard children or individuals at risk.

If you do not give us your information it might affect your application and the decision we make and we may not be able to process your application at all.

This information is only used for the reasons above but if we need to use it for any other reason we will normally tell you.

We may share your information with

We may share information provided with other bodies responsible for regulatory functions, safeguarding the public or the prevention and detection of fraud or crime or when we are required to share by law, these include:
