## Joint Winner for Outstanding Design

New Science Teaching Block,  
Thornton College, Thornton.

This modern building was developed to 'book end' the main elevation of the Grade II Listed main school building. It includes a suite of general classrooms downstairs with four laboratories and preparation rooms upstairs.

Designed by Acanthus Clews Architects, Banbury for Thornton College.



## Joint Winner for Outstanding Design

Highridge, Nr Aston Clinton.

A sustainable contemporary new home comprising two circular wings linked by a glass atrium with views over the Vale of Aylesbury.

Designed by Radclyffe Associates, Amersham for Mrs Crawford.





**Highly Commended for the excellent use of a restricted site to create a contemporary home that fits unobtrusively into the conservation area**

Seinna, Padbury.

A contemporary house which makes good use of a small triangular plot in the conservation area.



Concept design Emmerson Architects (now Niche Architects), London with design by HDA Architecture, Northampton and owned by Ms Tinson.

**Commended for providing a welcoming church and community facility**

Holy Trinity Church, Aylesbury.

A new entrance area which is linked with the body of the church by large glass walls and provides a coffee bar and meeting spaces, all fully accessible, together with links to the adjacent hall.

Designed by JCA Architects, Aylesbury for the Holy Trinity Walton Parish Church.



**Commended for sympathetic conversion of a redundant village landmark to a new business use**

The Mill, Waddeson.

A conversion which preserves the visual character of the mill and restores it to employment use. The large internal spaces are used for offices and retain many original features.

Designed by BSA Chesters Ltd, Long Crendon for the owner Mr Paine.



**Commended for skilled conservation of an important historic landmark building**

Brill Windmill.

Extensive repair of the Grade II\* listed windmill were undertaken. Work included the repair of historic timbers, replacing the tail ladder and renewing the sails.
